Possessive Adjectives

Examples

➤ I'm Italian.	➤ My family are from Rome.
➤ You're in Class 1.	➤ This is your classroom.
➤ He's the director.	➤ His name is Michael.
➤ She's your teacher.	➤ Her name is Tina.
➤ It's a language school.	➤ Its name is English House.
➤ We're an international school.	➤ Our students are from Europe and Asia.
➤ They're French students.	➤ Their names are Luc and Marie.

Rules

- We use possessive adjectives for people and things.

Example: **My family** are from Italy. **My car** is German.

- **his** = of a man, **her** = of a woman, **its** = of a thing
- **their** = of people or things
- Possessive adjectives don't change with plural nouns.

Correct: **our** students

Incorrect: ~~**ours**~~ students

It's or Its?

- Be careful with **it's** and **its**.

✓ **it's** = it is

Examples: **It's** a school. **It's** Spanish.

✓ **its** = possessive

Examples: **Its** name is English House. **Its** flag is red and yellow.
