Grammar Section: Types of Questions

1- Wh-Questions:

We use English questions all the time, because if you want to interact in English you have to ask a question to somebody else. When people interact in English, they exchange information, and sometimes you have to answer a question or there is a big possibility that you have to ask a question to another person.

Wh- questions (also called question words) are the questions which start with wh, for example: *what, when, where, which, who, whose, why and how.*

The Rule:

In order to form a question in English, you need to follow this rule:

• Word question + Auxiliary verbs (do/does, is, are, did, will) + subject + verb + the rest of the sentence +?
