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Grammar Section: Types of Questions (Part 2)

2- Yes/no Questions

Yes / No questions are also called **closed questions** because there are only two possible responses: Yes or No. In order to form a yes/no question, we must use one of these verbs:

- Be (am, is, are, was, were)
- Do (does, did)
- Have (has, had)
- Modal Verbs (can, could, may, should, etc.)

The rule:

The structure of a yes/no question using an auxiliary or modal verb is as follows:

Auxiliary verb (be, do or have) + subject + main verb +? or Modal verb + subject + main verb +? Examples:

- Is she a teacher?
- Had you visited Paris before?
- Could you finish the project earlier?
- Do you usually go to the park?
