

➤ **Grammar:**

Prepositions: at, on, in (Place & Time)

- Prepositions: **at, on, in** can actually establish relationship in both Space (Place) and Time as following:

A. Place:

Preposition	Use
At	Indicates a fixed point in relation to the position of something else.
On	Indicates the surface on which something rests.
In	Indicates an area (boundaries) or a volume (confines).

Examples 01:

- 1- There was a long queue of people **at** the bus stop.
- 2- She is wearing a silver ring **on** her little finger.
- 3- I was not sure whether I had come to the right office; there was no name **on** the door.
- 4- There are some beautiful trees **in** the park.
- 5- I wouldn't like an office job; I couldn't spend the whole day sitting **at** a desk.

B. Time:

Preposition	Use
At	Specific time (Night), Hour
On	Date, Day
In	Part of the day (the morning, the afternoon, the evening), Month, Year, Season, Long period (the future...)

Examples 02:

- 1- Her son was born **in** 2015.
- 2- My classmate likes reading **at** night.
- 3- I have a day off **on** Monday.
- 4- My friend's birthday is **on** the 26th of December.
- 5- We'll meet **at** 12:00 o'clock.
