We're meeting at 10.00 tomorrow in Richard's office.
Jane's leaving on Friday and coming back next Tuesday.
3. Will / shall + infinitive
a. Instant decisions, promises, offers, predictions, future facts, suggestions

I won't tell anybody where you are. (promise)
I'll carry that bag for you. (offer)
You'll love New York! (prediction)
Next year, Christmas Day will be on a Thursday. (future fact)
