Present perfect + for / since, present perfect continuous		
1) Vocabulary: strong adjectives		
Strong adjectives are extreme adjectives that have the idea of <i>very</i> .		
Examples:		
gorgeous = very beautiful		
huge = very big		
Exercise:		
1. A Was Lisa's father <u>angry</u> about the car accident?		
B Yes, he was <b>furious</b> !		
<b>2.</b> A Is Oliver's flat?		
B Yes, it's really tiny - just a bedroom and a sitting room.		
3. A Are you of flying?		
B Yes, I'm terrified! I never fly anywhere.		
<b>4.</b> A There was an documentary about whales on TV last night.		
B Yes, I thought it was <b>fascinating</b> .		
<b>5.</b> A Are you very?		
B I'm <b>starving</b> ! I haven't eaten all day.		
<b>6.</b> A Is your parents' house?		
B It's <b>huge</b> (or <b>enormous</b> ). It has seven bedrooms.		

**7.** A Was it\_\_\_\_\_\_ in Dubai?

B It was <b>boiling!</b> 45 degrees.
8. A Was Jack's kitchen?
B It was filthy. It took us three hours to clean it.
<b>9.</b> A Are your parents about the wedding?
B They're <b>delighted</b> . In fact, they want to pay for everything!
<b>10.</b> A Was the film?
B It was hilarious. We laughed the whole way through.
11. A Are you you locked the door?
B I'm <b>positive</b> . I remember turning the key.
12. A Were you to hear that Ted and Sonia have broken up?
B I was absolutely amazed! I never thought it would happen.
With strong adjectives like exhausted, you can use absolutely, completely, really, or
totally, but not very (NOT very exhausted). We often give strong adjectives extra stress.
